Conference on Innovation Decision Support Using Structured Expert Judgement

Building Expertise for Innovation

25-27 April 2017 Aalto University, Espoo, Finland

Objectives

This conference brings together experts from diverse scientific and professional backgrounds, with the aim of exploring and advancing the use of systematic analytical techniques in establishing a solid methodological foundation for developing innovations and innovation ecosystems that contribute to improved competitiveness and enhance the quality of life.

Particular emphasis will be placed on creating an improved understanding of

- (i) how digitalization as a pervasive technological force will transform industries, services and societies through systemic and even disruptive innovations;
- (ii) how analytical methods (including but not limited to expert judgement elicitation and synthesis) can be harnessed to enhance foresight activities, to support decisions in innovation and technology management, and to inform the shaping and implementation of effective innovation policies, broadly defined.

The conference is organized in collaboration with the COST Action IS1304 on Expert Judgment Network: Bridging the Gap Between Scientific Uncertainty and Evidence-Based Decision Making and the two projects of the Strategic Research Council of the Academy of Finland coordinated at the Aalto University School of Science by Professors Ahti Salo and Martti Mäntylä. These projects are Platform Value Now (PVN) and Digital Disruption in Industry (DDI).


There is no registration fee for participants who attend the conference through the COST IS1304 Action.

Venue

The Conference is held at the <u>Aalto Design Factory</u>, located on the Aalto University Otaniemi campus about 10 km to the west of Helsinki. There are two large contiguous spaces as well as numerous smaller rooms which allow COST IS1304 Working Groups to run their meetings efficiently.

Schedule

The Conference starts on Tuesday afternoon, 25 April, with a general meeting at 4pm. This meeting will be followed by a reception by the City of Espoo, to be held either on the premises of the Aalto University or at the <u>Espoo Cultural Centre</u> in Tapiola.

Except for keynote talks, the Scientific Programme is planned to consist of two parallel streams. One will be focused on topics that are central to the COST IS1304 Action (methods and applications of structured expert judgment). These are solicited by by circulating this Call for Presentations within the Action and the networks of its members.

The other stream contains presentations which address broader topics in relation to the theme innovation (e.g., the use of other analytical and computational techniques in support of innovation decision making). The two SRC projects will be active in soliciting such presentations.

The conference dinner will be held on Wednesday, 26 April, at <u>Haltia</u>, the Finnish Nature Centre which won the European Museum of the Year Award in 2015.
